

# THE SESSION, AT ITS NOVEMBER 22, 2021 MEETING, APPROVED THE FOLLOWING UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY:

- 1. We strongly encourage that those who are not fully vaccinated wear a mask in an indoor setting, including children 2-years old and up for all activities.
- 2. While masks are not required for those who are fully vaccinated, we encourage anyone who is uncomfortable to continue wearing a mask.
- 3. We feel individualized meals are no longer necessary and common utensils may be used. FPC will publicize how meals will be served. This includes eating indoors, baking projects, homecooked meals, restaurant dining, Sunday morning fellowship, etc. The use of hand sanitizer and social distancing are encouraged during meals.
- 4. Offering will resume with the traditional method of passing of the plates on December 5, 2021.
- 5. We look forward to resuming all ministry programs in January 2022, including "traditional" communion.
