FPC Sumter (then called Sumterville) was organized at a Harmony Presbytery meeting by Evangelist Rev. Isaac Barbour on May 29, 1823.

From Bob's Desk . . .

We have made it. We have made it to the year that we have been hoping for and planning for. Our church is now celebrating 200 years of ministry in the name of Jesus Christ. Founded in 1823, we have worshipped, welcomed, baptized, educated, outreached, buried, and loved one another and our community for two



centuries. God has given our congregation great stamina to witness to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior in times of plenty and in times of want, in times of peace and in times of war, in times of great happiness and in times of deep sadness, in times of health and in times of sickness, in times of togetherness and in times of division, in times of strength and in times of weakness. First Presbyterian Church of Sumter has endured. And whenever we have made it from one year to the next, it has been an act of the Holy Spirit and of a God who has not given up on us. With humility and thanksgiving, we enter our year of celebration. With God's help we have made it to 2023.

This first newsletter of the year is an invitation to you to participate as completely as possible in this milestone in our history and to strengthen it by your presence in the many plans that have been made. Please go ahead and mark your calendars for three specific Sundays that will be a blessing to all of us: Sunday, February 12; Sunday, May 7; and Sunday, November 19. Each of these Sundays will include worship and a congregational luncheon, and each will highlight the mission of our church. The preaching mission of our pulpit will be marked by former pastors returning and delivering the sermon in September and throughout the year. Each of these Sundays will include a reception following worship. In addition, a new historical marker will be dedicated on our campus in the coming months, and we will host the meeting of New Harmony Presbytery on Tuesday, May 16!

Our very busy 200th Anniversary committee has been hard at work producing a large collection of videos of members sharing their memories and thanksgivings for First Presbyterian Church. We are thinking about ways that we can make these reflections available to all. The committee has also designed a new logo for our celebration year which will be featured on notecards, shirts, and Christmas ornaments. New celebration paraments are being made for the sanctuary, and a large outdoor banner will announce our church anniversary to the community. News articles and press releases will let the world know that something special is happening at First Presbyterian Church.

In thanksgiving for our fine music ministry, we have chosen a hymn to be sung and shared throughout our celebration: Hymn 314, "Christ, Be Our Light." The last verse embodies my hope for our congregation: "Many the gifts, many the people, many the hearts that yearn to belong. Let us be servants to one another, making your kingdom come." We will find the refrain very singable: "Christ, be our light! Shine in our hearts. Shine through the darkness. Christ, be our light! Shine in your church gathered today."

We have made it to our 200^{th} year of ministry in this place. Congratulations!
