#### SESSION REPORT

#### From the October 17, 2023, Stated Meeting

At the stated October 17, 2023 meeting, the Session recognized or acted on the following items:

- Herb Laird will serve as Stewardship chair for 2023. The theme will be from Matthew 5:13-16 "Christ Be Our Light—Glorifying God Forever."
- Revisited the plan to relocate the library. The Session approved that it will be moved instead down the hall to a nearby location on the second floor. The archives displays will be moved into the current library with display cases also located in niches in the hallway. The current archives room will be used as a storage area for archives.
- Approved a Nativity display loaned by members of FPC in the Fellowship Hall for the first two Sundays of Advent— December 3-10, to be picked up by December 12.
- Approved the purchase of new liquid-filled candles for the Communion Table in the Sanctuary due to the difficulty of lighting our current candles, as well as the ability of the candles to stay lit.
- Approved the construction of a wooden box to serve as a time capsule for storage of 2023 Celebration memories which will be kept in the Archives Room.
- Approved \$15,000 from Capital Improvements for repairs and upgrades to the West Youth Center.

The Session requests that you continue to keep the PNC in your prayers, as they search to find the pastor that God has already found for us. We will continue to work to serve the Lord through our church, our community, and our world.
