Dear Friends in Christ,

We have a meditation opportunity for you. The Presbyterian Heritage Center in Montreat exhibits the artistic works of the Rev. John Mack Walker, who was the pastor at the Presbyterian Church of Roanoke Rapids, NC, for 38 years.



Beginning at age 28, Johnny Mack began carving in wood, and people began bringing him wood from all over the world to use in his sculptures. Even after retiring to Montreat, he carved scenes from the life of Jesus in these beautiful hardwoods, often depicting the biblical characters as men and women he had met in the Appalachian Mountains.

At his death in 1998 at age 83, Johnny Mack Walker's family left 24 of his amazing woodcarvings on permanent display at the Presbyterian Heritage Center in Montreat. We will see them on our upcoming trip to Montreat with our church. Fortunately, a **40-minute video** was produced before his death with Johnny Mack giving us a tour of some of these carvings and commenting on the scenes from the life of Jesus. I have a VHS video of this production, and **we have set it up in the church parlor** to be viewed by our church members and friends any time the office is open. You are welcome to come and enjoy it.

Many who have visited with the Rev. Johnny Mack Walker, minister and artist, through this video have told us they want to return and see it again. I commend it to you for your journey in the faith.
