This year our church has signed up to take groups of volunteers to the Processing Center in Charlotte where the boxes are checked for quality and then boxed up to be on their way. The dates are November 30th (Wednesday) from 1-5 and December 3rd (Saturday) from 2-6. Members of our church who have worked at the Processing Center in the past have had wonderful things to say about the experience! The sign-up sheets for these trips are outside the church office! Participants have to be registered, and you will be contacted to coordinate transportation.

If you don't want to shop yourself but want to participate, please put a check for \$25 in the Offering Plate or in the mail with Operation Christmas Child on the memo line, and one of the folk working on this project will shop on your behalf. This will cover both the contents and the shipping.

We are now able to find out where each of our boxes has gone. The label in your box has a QR code on it. You can scan the code with your cell phone and register online to receive notification of when and where your shoebox has been delivered. You can also pay the suggested \$10 shipping fee online.
