

OUTDOOR WORSHIP TO RESUME MARCH 7

Upon recommendation from the Re-Opening Task Force, Session has approved to move forward with corporate worship, starting with the resumption of outdoor worship and continuing toward the goal of meeting for worship in the sanctuary. Of primary concern is the health and safety of our membership. We are encouraged by the increasing number of people getting the COVID-19 vaccine and by the decrease in COVID-19 hospital admissions from the record highs recorded in January. There continues to be a need for vigilance and adherence to the three primary defenses against the coronavirus: social distancing, wearing of masks in public, and hand-washing.

With these considerations in mind, Session has approved to resume outdoor worship on Sunday, March 7 and continuing through Easter Sunday, April 4. **Services will begin at 11:00 a.m.** and last for approximately 45 minutes. Outdoor services will be broadcast live for those who prefer to engage in virtual worship online. The task force will meet again in March to consider health and safety factors affecting our progress toward resuming worship in the sanctuary. We continue to monitor what other churches in the Sumter area are doing with respect to worship services.

Beginning Thursday, February 25, Nick is offering a "Noon-Zoom" book study. The Buildings and Grounds Committee has been working very hard to provide solutions to our storage and space/esthetics problems.

It was decided, by the committee, and approved by Session, to pursue a project which transforms the Parlor from a Multi-purpose Room back to a single-use Parlor space with no storage of equipment or conference-table activities. The conference table will be moved to the current reception space in the administrative offices, and Reception will be moved to an updated space in the corridor intersection

adjacent to the Fellowship Hall. New custom-made reception center furniture is being built for this space so as to provide better access and security control for the building. The project which is currently under construction consists of erecting a wall on the east end of the current Parlor space eight (8) feet from the rear wall to provide much-needed storage for the chairs (which are currently stored in the corridor leading to the Chapel) and the round tables which are used in the Fellowship Hall for banquet meals and larger meetings. The new storage room will have double doors for access from the adjacent corridor. The existing double doors will be moved to the storage room and new French style wood doors with full glass will be installed in the Parlor. In addition, a new single door with full glass will be added on the west end of the Parlor to make it more accessible from the corridor. The space will be painted and the carpet professionally cleaned as a part of the project.

The finishes in the Fellowship Hall will be thoroughly updated as a part of the project as well. Vinyl wall covering will be installed over the concrete block walls and a wainscot will be added to match the existing chair rail and baseboard. The entire space will be painted and professionally cleaned as well.

This project is being funded by a very generous gift to our Church from the Roddey family.

Elders should have already proven themselves to be committed and dedicated to the life, ministry, and mission of the church. (Book of Order G-2.0301)
- ➤ **DEACONS** The office of Deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of sympathy, witness and service after the example of Jesus Christ. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, of exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, warm sympathies, and sound judgment should be chosen for this office. (Book of Order G-2.0201)
