

### THE SARASOTA STATEMENT

In 2017 a group of PCUSA pastors, lay leaders and theology professors gathered together expressing a mutual concern over the state of our nation and Church. They were disheartened by a perceived division in the people of God, especially in the political realm. Let's face it, over that past

few years politics in America has become increasingly partisan and ruthless. In the midst of discord, how are we to act and believe as a people of God. How are we to let our faith inform our politics as those who seek to follow after our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ first and foremost? The Sarasota Statement aimed to put words to our feelings. Below is an expert that speaks to our current context. I hope you will join with me and let the words speak to you heart, mind and soul.

### PART II To the people we dehumanize and dismiss on the basis of political and ideological differences, and those who suffer at the hands of our idolatry:

We trust in Jesus Christ, the Servant-Lord of all,<sup>30</sup> whose ministry liberates the oppressed, welcomes the outcast, and upends systems of death-dealing power.<sup>31</sup> Through humility and sacrifice Jesus brings life to all and commissions his followers to do the same.<sup>32</sup> We grieve that the Church conflates Jesus' message with political platforms and looks to partisan ideologies to affirm its ethics and action.<sup>33</sup> We grieve that we idolize<sup>34</sup> political leaders and fail to measure their promises and policies against God's law of love.35 We grieve that our political ideologies deceive and distract us from the demands of a lived faith: to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God.<sup>36</sup> We commit to pray for our leaders to support and enact policies that further God's redeeming justice throughout the world.<sup>37</sup> We also commit to doing our part, working to empower those who have systematically been excluded from the benefits of democracy and equity.<sup>38</sup> Therefore, we will vigilantly speak against tyranny,<sup>39</sup> resist the temptation to claim privilege for ourselves, 40 and oppose efforts that co-opt our faith for partisan gain. In fidelity to God alone,<sup>41</sup> we share in Christ's love for all people and nations, 42 denying and denouncing any nationalism and allegiances that compromise this love.


