Sunday's March with Pastors, Police and our Sumter Community was a wonderful showing of love and unity in purpose. I'm grateful for the leadership of Clay Smith, Marion Newton, our Police, and also our Sumter congregations for representing. Below is the prayer I wrote and read from the Court House.

A reading from the gospel of Matthew Chapter 6 – "Our Lord God who is in heaven... your name is holy... Thy Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven."

Let us pray:

Every week Lord, most of us pray these words with our congregations. We pray Thy Kingdom come. We pray for a kingdom here on earth as it is in heaven - A kingdom filled with everlasting peace, when there will be no more destruction, no more wars, no more violence and hatred.

We pray for a time when we will beat our swords into plowshares.

We pray Thy Kingdom come! For a time when there will be no more dissension or anger between humanity. We pray for a time when there will be a true and honest unity among the peoples of the world and our nation. We pray Thy Kingdom come.

But for too long Lord, and too often, we have forgotten these words we pray. Too often your church has remained silent in times of social change - especially the white Christian church. We have closed our eyes, Lord. We have turned away from our purpose to shine light and hope in the world and community around us. We have lost sight of our first calling - to follow you as we love our neighbor as ourselves.

Therefore, we confess Lord. We confess our own participation in the status quo which separates and distorts humanity. We confess that we have sinned.

We confess our failures to speak out against injustice. We confess those times when we, as individuals and as churches, have observed the fracturing of humanity and yet have remained silent. We confess those times when we have been in positions of power and yet, have chosen not to exercise that power while another human suffered.

We confess the sin of racist exclusion, the abuse of power to oppress and degrade. We pray for our churches. May they become places of reconciliation and witness, where each human soul is valued, and where equality in Christ is a reality in our midst. Forgive us for when we fail to live out our calling as your people. May our churches model the new humanity of Christ...in thy kingdom come

And so we pray,

Thy Kingdom come, Lord... for the broken and disenfranchised.

We pray Thy Kingdom come... for the oppressed and the falsely accused.

We pray Thy Kingdom come... for parents who stay up late worrying about their son or daughter coming back home alive at night.

We pray Thy Kingdom come... for families whose fathers, sons, brothers, daughters, mothers and sisters have been unjustly taken away -- lives stolen from them.

We pray, Thy Kingdom come... for our eyes to be opened and hearts softened to the disparities within our nation, within our state and within our city.

We pray, Thy Kingdom come... for policies and leaders that work for the benefit of all, not only the rich and powerful.

We pray thy Kingdom come... for all people to be loved, cared for, advocated for, supported, protected equally. Because until all of America is truly free, none of us will be.

We pray, Thy Kingdom come... for a nation that values all life, for a nation and city that won't sleep until racism is stomped out forever

We pray for Thy Kingdom come... when all races, all colors, all cultures will be able to sit down at one big giant table and feast together equally as brothers and sisters -- the family of God.

And Lord, we also know that we can't only pray, but we must act. We, as your people, are not called to simply fold our arms and wait for your kingdom to come. NO! You command us to partner with you to help bring this Kingdom of peace and unity into fruition here and now.

God give us the strength, the fortitude, the resilience, and the unapologetic faith to do so, until there is an end to division and the dawning of a truly equal human society built on love.

We ask this in the name of Jesus, amen.
