"DO YOU KNOW WHAT THEY DID?"

(Forgiveness Series – Three)

<u>Introduction</u>: One of the most well-known fathers in the Bible is the father of the prodigal son (*Luke 15:11-32*). This father demonstrates how God forgives His children. It is a <u>model</u> for all believers to follow (*Colossians 3:13*).

I. THE FATHER FORGAVE BEFORE HE WAS ASKED

Note: Sins and offenses break <u>fellowship</u>, not <u>relationship</u>!

II. THE FATHER <u>DESIRED</u> TO BE RECONCILED

Note: Reconciliation requires two people!

III. FORGIVENESS AND RECONCILIATION DOES <u>NOT</u> ERASE CONSEQUENCES OF OFFENSES / SINS

- 1. Forgiveness and reconciliation could <u>not</u> restore the wasted years of sin.
- 2. The youngest son wasted his inheritance.
- 3. His sins damaged his fellowship with his brother.

Note: The father sought to be a peacemaker and so should we.

<u>Conclusion</u>: This famous parable of Jesus provides <u>hope</u>, but <u>warnings</u> in relationships with God and people.
