### 2020: The Year of the Bible

This coming year has been designated "The Year of the Bible" in which Christians are encouraged to read through the entire Bible in the course of the year. Our church council is taking the challenge and encouraging all the members of our congregation to do so as well! We want to read through it together as a church family and will be providing a number of different ways to do so, as well as opportunities to have discussions about the readings. The Bible can be read straight through in about 70 hours, but we are going to take the next 12 months to do it. The Bible has 1,189 chapters so if one reads 3.25 chapters per day it can be done in a year.

There are so many reasons to read the Bible. Here are ten that come to mind:

- 1. "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of Christ." (Romans 10:17)
- 2. "Blessed is the one who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy." (Revelation 1:3)
- 3. "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work." (II Timothy 3:16,17)
- 4. "The Word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart." (Hebrews 4:12)
- 5. "So shall My Word be which goes forth from My mouth; it will not return to Me empty, but will accomplish what I desire." (Isaiah 55:11)
- 6. "Your Word I have treasured in my heart, that I might not sin against You." (Psalm 119:11)
- 7. "Your Word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Psalm 119:105)
- 8. "Not one of the good promises which the Lord had made to the house of Israel failed; all came to pass." (Joshua 21:45)
- 9. "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God." (Matthew 4:4)
- 10. "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the Words of eternal life." (John 6:68)

This will be a great opportunity to encourage each other in reading God's Word and to grow in our faith together throughout this coming year! Our entire congregation will be blessed and strengthened together as a church family by spending this committed time in Scripture.

## Patty Condre

Patty Condre is a prime example of what happens when a child grows to adulthood at Ruthfred. Her faith in God has been built brick by brick on a solid Biblical foundation for fifty-five years.



Patty's parents, Patricia Jean and Charles, were married in the Ruthfred chapel in 1959. Because Pastor Dennis was ill for the big day, the pastor from Bethany Lutheran filled in. The Condres built a sturdy stone house on Brightwood Road in Bethel Park, but sadly, Patricia Jean passed away when Patty was just nine, leaving her and her father alone in the home. He passed when she was twenty-seven.

Three years ago, Patty sold the house and moved to a townhome in South Fayette where she lives with her dog, Daisy. She holds a degree in Medical Technology from California University of Pennsylvania. Patty works for Quest Diagnostics in Greentree, running tests for various things including drugs and lead.

About two years ago, Patty joined a group on Facebook for weight loss. One thing led to another, and she ended up joining a running club through the Fleet Feet store in Upper St. Clair. She highly recommends their approach.

She says they take you from couch to competition with deliberate strategies she has found to be fun and beneficial. Patty runs three times per week on her own and has competed in races up to 10 K.

When Patty isn't running, she likes to ride her bicycle on the Montour Trail. Unfortunately, she isn't doing either activity right now as she had a tumble on the North Shore during a recent run and needs time to heal.

Patty is a very loyal member of the church. Back in high school, she was one of the first youth in TNT. As an adult, she worked with TNT for about ten years. She has sung in the Senior Choir and is a regular attendee in the adult Sunday School class. Patty also serves on the Benevolence Committee at Ruthfred.

Personal devotions include *Portals of Prayer* and *Jesus Calling*, a book by Sarah Young. Patty loves our old hymnal, finding meaning and depth in the lyrics. She likes how the book is divided into themes and church seasons. Patty has memorized scripture by singing the hymns over the years.

God has been at work through Ruthfred Lutheran Church all of Patty's life. Patty says every one of the pastors has been exceptional. Members have been faithful friends. Currently she is enjoying the classes that explore the Old Testament and is learning how it connects to the books of the New Testament. She says that the more she learns from the Bible, the better she appreciates that "God put His touch on everything."

#### Congregational Budget meeting

November 17, 2019

The members present at the congregational budget meetings (after both the 8:30 and 11 AM services) of November 17, 2019 approved the 2020 Budget as submitted, as well as the proposed amendment to the Articles of Incorporation.

#### **Church Council Meeting**

November 21, 2019

- The Benevolence Committee report noted that Ben Jore has accepted a salaried position and was no longer in need of support from Ruthfred. The Committee therefore added those monies to the Special Benevolence budget.
- Thanksgiving Day offerings will be divided between Voice of the Martyrs and City Mission.
- Council approved the transfer of \$5,500 from the Current Fund to the Benevolence Fund to cover budgeted benevolences.

## Mary, Did You Know?

#### Mary, did you know . . . that your baby boy has walked where angels trod?

Over the years Christians have been intrigued with speculating about what it was like to be Jesus' parents. To what extent did the young teen-mother Mary and her husband Joseph truly comprehend what was happening that first Christmas? They surely had some understanding that there was something very special about their Son, what with the visits from the angels, the virgin conception, the words of Mary's relative Elizabeth, the visit from the shepherds, and the fact that Herod wanted their son dead. However, "knowing" things as a teenager is not the same as "knowing" those same things through the lens of decades of experience and hindsight. With all that being said, one of my favorite Christmas verses is Luke 2:19: "But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart."

#### Mary, did you know . . . when you kiss your little baby, you kiss the face of God?

Then there's the curiosity about what is was like to raise the Son of God from infancy, through childhood, to adulthood. The Bible gives us precious little narrative about this. Did Jesus go through a terrible two's stage? Did Mary ever have to put him in time-out? What was it like to teach him Bible stories, like creation, the exodus, the prophecies of Isaiah? What kind of student was Jesus in school? These are all questions we may never know the answers to, however interesting they may be to think about.

#### Mary, did you know . . . that your baby boy is heaven's perfect lamb?

Mark Lowry, an American singer, comedian, and songwriter, had these kinds of questions on his mind back in the 1980's when he was developing a Christmas program for his church. "I just tried to put into words the unfathomable. I started thinking of the questions I would have for her if I were to sit down and have coffee with Mary. You know, 'What was it like raising God?' 'What did you know?' 'What didn't you know?'" (Wikipedia) Script from this program evolved into the lyrics we know today and was set to music in 1991 by Buddy Greene, a musician perhaps most famous for his legendary harmonica playing.

In Lowry's lyrics the name "Mary" appears some 15 times. The name "Jesus" does not appear even once. The irony, of course, is that his song is not really about Mary at all. It is about her son, God's Son. Ultimately it is not what we know about Mary that is important. What is crucial is that we know the One who walked on water, calmed a storm with His hand, gave sight to a blind man, healed the deaf and dumb, raised the dead, is Lord of all creation, and saves us and makes us new!

#### Mary, did you know . . . that sleeping child you're holding is the great I Am?
