DEVOTION GUIDE

Verse of the Week: "After John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee announcing God's good news, saying, 'Now is the time! Here comes God's kingdom! Change your hearts and lives, and trust this good news!" (Mark 1:14-15, CEB).

Daily Prayer: O Lord, from whom all good things come: grant to us your humble servants, that, by your holy inspiration we may think those things that be good, and by your merciful guiding may perform the same;through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: This week's readings begin our journey through the New Testament. While we are hearing from Mark in worship, our reading begins with Luke. Notice the different ways in which these two writers tell the Gospel story:

- **3.** In listening to the message and reading from Luke, what do these texts teach you about Jesus?
- 4. You may also respond to the questions in the Immerse: Messiah reading plan card.
