The Word Became Flesh: An Introduction to the Gospel of John

Verse of the Week:

"We announce to you what existed from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have seen and our hands handled, about the word of life." 1 John 1:1 (CEB)

Daily Prayer:

O God, we praise you for the witness of the Gospels. Grant that we may so become immersed in the story of Jesus that the stories of our lives are changed by our encounters with him. Amen.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – John 1:1-8 **Tuesday** – John 1:9-18 **Wednesday** – John 1:19-28
Thursday – 1 John 1:1-4 **Friday** – 1 John 1:5-10 **Saturday** – Revelation 1:1-8

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. What is the most interesting biography you have ever read? What interested you most about the subject? How would you describe the subject based on the biographer's work?
2. Which of the Gospels do you tend to read the most? Why?
3. What excites you about this study of the Gospel of John? What questions do you bring to this series? What do you hope to learn?
4. What are some of the consistent themes you see in this week's reading across the writings attributed to John? How do these themes help you to better understand who Jesus is?
5. What does it mean to you to be a "beloved disciple" of Jesus? What do you think might be some characteristics of a "beloved disciple?"

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for those who have yet to encounter the story of Jesus, and that the Holy Spirit would give you courage to tell your story of faith in him.

Tuesday - Pray for those living in the darkness of sin, addiction, fear, and despair; ask God shine the light of his grace on them.

Wednesday - Pray for those concerns listed on the TLUMC prayer list this week.

Thursday - Pray for those who are persecuted for their faith.

Friday - Pray for the Tri-Lakes community and for a fresh revival of Christian faith.

Saturday - Pray for our worship services on Sunday and for all who will attend.


