Daily Prayer: Creator God, help us to live the promise of resurrection in the present, doing all things to your eternal praise and glory. Amen.

Introduction to this week’s Scripture readings: This week’s readings focus on the promises of resurrection in the Old and New Testaments.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday - Ezekiel 37:1-14 - Resurrection and return from exile

Tuesday - Isaiah 26:1-21 - Your dead will live

Wednesday - John 11:17-46 - The resurrection and the life

Thursday - 1 Corinthians 15:1-34 - The good news of resurrection

Friday - 1 Corinthians 15:35-58 - Our resurrection from the dead

Saturday - Revelation 20:11-21:8 - Resurrection and new creation

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. How did you respond to this week’s message? What insights and questions did it raise for you?
2. Why is belief in the bodily resurrection so important to Christian faith? Compare and contrast it with other contemporary images of life after death.
3. Daniel’s vision of resurrection stoked courage in people during tough times. How does the promise of resurrection increase your courage and resolve in whatever trial you are facing?
4. How would you summarize the “good news” in the Book of Daniel?

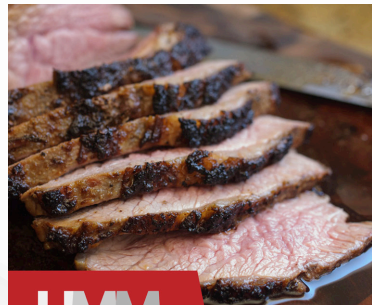

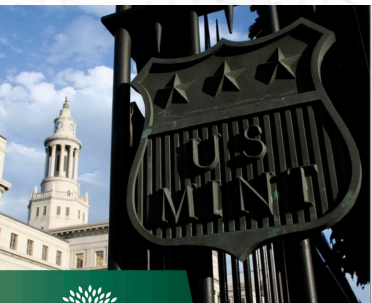

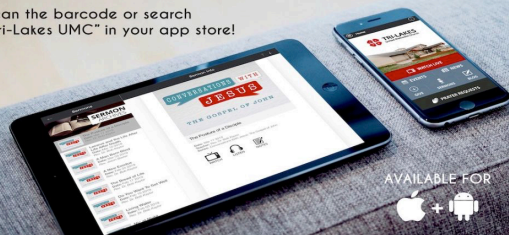
