Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. How did you respond to this week's message? What insights and questions did it raise for you?
2. How would you describe “biblical authority” in your own words?
3. Describe your own relationship with the Bible. How do you read it, when do you read it, and what does it mean to you?
4. Have you ever read through the entire Bible? How does the prospect of doing so in community with others excite you? Concern you? Challenge you?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for people around the world who have never heard the story of the Bible.

Tuesday - Pray for those who are struggling in their faith.

Wednesday - Pray for those requests listed on our TLUMC prayer list and prayer wall.

Thursday - Pray for a revival among the churches.

Friday - Pray for scholars and others who translate and interpret the Bible.

Saturday - Pray for those who will attend worship at TLUMC this Sunday. Pray that God's Spirit draw new people into our midst who are seeking an encounter with God.

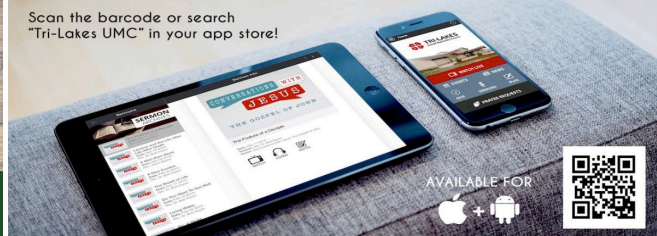

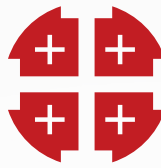
