Text: Daniel 10

Devotion Guide

The Gift of Strength

Verse of the Week: "He said, 'Don't be afraid. You are greatly treasured. All will be well with you. Be strong!" (Daniel 10:19)

Daily Prayer: Holy Spirit, shine your light into our hearts and lives. Awaken us where we slumber. Expose the darkness we try to hide. Uncover what we are afraid to see. Greet us with the warmth of your love that we may choose to walk in your grace and live by your light. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: The Psalms are the prayer book of the church. They contain the prayers of those crying out to God in the midst of their real-life struggles. All of this week's readings come from the Psalms (except for Saturday), and all are short readings, focusing on strength. Read each one slowly and meditatively at least four times. Pause between readings and be silent so the Lord can speak to you.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday - Psalm 46:1 Tuesday - Psalm 18:1-2 Wednesday - Psalm 22:19 Thursday - Psalm 59:9-10 Friday - Psalm 28:6-8 Saturday - Daniel 11

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. What does it look like for God to give us strength?
- 2. Describe a time when you felt overwhelmed by future circumstances. How did God give you strength in those circumstances? Did you notice the strength being given at the time or did you only perceive it in hindsight?
- 3. What are some ways you would like God to strengthen you right now?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for strength for those dealing with significant broken relationships. **Tuesday** - Pray for strength for those struggling with depression, anxiety, or any other mental health issues.

Wednesday - Pray for strength for service men and women away from their families and for their families.

Thursday - Pray for strength for those with health concerns.

Friday - Pray for strength for those facing financial difficulties.

Saturday - Pray for the Holy Spirit to move in power during our worship service on Sunday.
