TLUMC Vision Statement

Theologically Traditional

We affirm the authority of Scripture

We use the Bible as the authoritative source for our life and faith and believe that it contains all things necessary for salvation.

And confess “the faith once delivered to the saints” (Jude 3)

We draw our essential theological, doctrinal, and ethical convictions from the Scriptures and the Apostles’ and Nicene Creeds.

With a distinctly Methodist perspective.

We are classically Methodist in our expression of faith, practice, and discipline.

Personally Transformational

We pursue holiness of heart and life

We believe that every Christian is called by God through the power of the Holy Spirit to journey toward holiness. We understand holiness as extravagant love for God, sacrificial love of neighbor, and freedom from the power of sin. This transformation is inwardly experienced and outwardly demonstrated.

Through the means of grace

A Christian grows in holiness by attending regularly to the means of grace: searching, reading, meditating, and studying the Scriptures; prayer; fasting; attending worship; partaking of Holy Communion; and participation in Christian community.

Especially by watching over one another in love through involvement in small groups.

Transformation takes place most effectively when Christians meet in small groups designed for support, encouragement, help in overcoming sin, and instruction in the life of holiness.

Outwardly Missional

As our historic Methodist General Rules state, “we seek to do all the good we can to the bodies and souls of people”

While we believe we are saved by God’s grace alone, we also believe we are saved for God’s mission in the world (Eph 2.8-10). We do good works for others so that they may experience the comprehensive salvation of God: relational, physical, and spiritual wholeness.

Through acts of compassion, service, and justice

Jesus commanded us to pray that God’s Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven; thus, we work for what we pray for. We work for individual and social transformation so that when the Kingdom of God comes in its fullness it is not a culture shock.

For all people (especially the marginalized) locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally.

We take seriously Jesus’ Great Commission (Matt 28.18-20) and follow an Acts 1.8 model for missions, seeing the world as our parish. Our mission field is Jerusalem (Monument/Tri-Lakes area), Judea (Pikes Peak Region), Samaria (the socially out-cast), and the ends of the earth (the U.S. and beyond).

Devotion Guide

Verse of the Week: "Rather, you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Daily Prayer: Almighty God, through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, you revealed the way of eternal life to every race and nation: Pour out this gift anew, that by the preaching of the Gospel your salvation may reach to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: All of the readings this week relate to missions. Note in the readings the balance between meeting spiritual and physical needs in mission. Note also the varied backgrounds of the people in these texts who are the focus of mission.

Wednesday - Matthew 9:35-38

Thursday - Matthew 25:31-46

Friday - Luke 5:27-31

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. When you hear the word "missions" what does it bring to mind? Does the word evoke excitement or apprehension?
2. What has been your experience with missions?
3. Why is it important to have a balanced emphasis on meeting physical and spiritual needs in our mission efforts?
4. Of the local, regional, and international mission opportunities mentioned in the sermon, which one or ones appeal to you most? Why? How might you get involved?

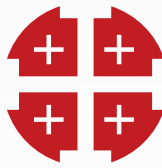
