Pastor: On this fourth Sunday of Advent, we are confronted with a sobering reminder as we follow the medieval tradition of the last four things. Today, we light the candle representing hell. It has become out of fashion to talk about hell. Yet, our discomfort with the topic makes it no less a reality or possibility. We should spend less time avoiding the subject and more time fleeing the reality. Hell confronts us with the fact that our choices have consequences. Our choice regarding how we respond to the first advent dictates our experience of the second one. As Jesus said in John 12:47-50:

Lay Reader: "If anyone hears my words but does not keep them, I do not judge that person. For I did not come to judge the world, but to save the world. There is a judge for the one who rejects me and does not accept my words; the very words I have spoken will condemn them at the last day. For I did not speak on my own, but the Father who sent me commanded me to say all that I have spoken. I know that his command leads to eternal life. So whatever I say is just what the Father has told me to say."

Verse of the Week:

So they come to you as people do, and they sit before you as my people. They listen to your words, but they refuse to do them. Though they speak of their longing for me, they act out of their own interests and opinions. To them you are like a singer of love songs with a lovely voice and skilled technique. They listen to your words, but no one does them. (Ezekiel 33:31-32)

Daily Prayer:

O God, we yearn to belong to You utterly. In times when such yearning is faint to nonexistent, grant us the grace to long to yearn that we may belong to you utterly. You are such a Father that You take our sins from us and throw them behind Your back. Cleanse our souls as Your Son washed our feet. We hold up our hearts to You: make them what they must be.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Mark 14:32-42 Tuesday – Luke 18:18-30 Wednesday – Matthew 7:1-5
Thursday – Matthew 7:15-20 Friday – Matthew 7:24-27 Saturday – Matthew 9:9-13

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. How did the Holy Spirit speak to you in worship this week during the music, prayers, message, Communion, etc.?
- 2. In what ways do I share the same struggles that Herod Antipas had?
- 3. What is the current trajectory of my life? Is it Jesus-ward or Herod Antipas-ward?
- 4. Why is it important to discuss hell? What are appropriate ways to do so in our world?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Ask God to reveal any blind spots in your life that are preventing you from recognizing Jesus and welcoming Him into your life.

Tuesday - Pray for all of the visitors who will attend our church for Christmas Eve services. If anyone as not welcomed Jesus at this first Advent, pray they will.

Wednesday - Give thanks for the incarnation. Reflect on the greatness of God who would enter our condition in order to save us and redeem creation.

Thursday - Pray for wisdom and guidance regarding significant decisions you have to make. Pray that God would guide you to a decision that leads your life in a Christ-ward trajectory.

Friday - Pray for the concerns sent out via the TLUMC email this week.

Saturday - Pray that all who attend worship on Sunday will experience the transforming presence of the Holy Spirit.


