Daily Devotional Guide Forerunner: The Life of John the Baptist A People Prepared for the Lord

Verse of the Week:

"And he will go before the Lord in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord." (Luke 1:17 NIV)

Daily Prayer:

We ask you, almighty God, let our souls enjoy this their desire, to be enkindled by your Spirit, that being filled as lamps by your divine gift, we may shine like burning lights before the presence of your Son Christ at his coming; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen - The Gelasian Sacramentary (8th century)

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Isaiah 2:1-5 Tuesday – Matthew 24:36-44 Wednesday –Romans 13:11-14 Thursday –Matthew 25:1-13 Friday – 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 Saturday –Revelation 21:1-8

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. Based on this week's message, how would you define a "prophet?" How can you determine the difference between a real prophet and a false one?
- 2. This week's readings are all about the "last days" and preparation for Christ's return. What feelings and thoughts arise in you when you consider these "last things?"
- 3. The ministry of John the Baptist calls us to consider two questions: What time is it? Am I ready? How would you answer those questions for yourself?
- 4. Read all of Zechariah's prophecy in Luke 1:67-79. In your own words, describe how ministry of John the Baptist is the link between the Old and New Testaments.
- 5. Consider David Rohrer's quote: "We are ready for God when we've had enough of ourselves." How has that proven true in your own experience?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for God's Kingdom to come on earth as it is in heaven.

Tuesday - Look at your news feed today. Pray for those dark places in our world that need the light of Christ.

Wednesday - Pray for Christians around the world who are facing persecution for their faith.

Thursday - Pray for those who are considering where they might go to church on Christmas Eve. Ask the Holy Spirit to draw them closer to faith.

Friday - Pray for the day ahead and ask God to help you live in light of Christ's coming.

Saturday - Pray for our worship services on Sunday and for all who will attend.


