Introduction to this week's *Immerse* New Testament Scripture readings (Week 8): This week's readings move from Philippians and Paul's powerful witness to the example of Jesus into the "Pastoral Epistles," where Paul offers mentoring and advice to young church leaders Timothy and Titus:

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. How did you respond to this week's message? What insights and questions did it raise for you?
- 2. Philippians offers us Paul's vision of what he gave up to follow Christ's example. What might you have to give up in order to follow Jesus on the road of discipleship?
- **3.** Jesus makes it clear that confessing he is the Christ and following him on the road to the cross are two different but interrelated things. How does following Jesus change the way you live?
- 4. How does Paul's advice to Timothy and Titus relate to the way of the cross?
- 5. You may also respond to the questions in the Immerse: Messiah reading plan card.

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for those who are persecuted for their Christian faith around the world. **Tuesday -** Pray for boldness to follow Jesus even when it is unpopular.
