

## DEVOTION GUIDE

**Verse of the Week:** "But John told Herod, 'It's against the law for you to marry your brother's wife!' So Herodias had it in for John. She wanted to kill him, but she couldn't" (Mark 6:18-19).

**Daily Prayer:** Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, grant, we pray, that we might be grounded and settled in your truth by the coming of your Holy Spirit into our hearts. What we do not know, reveal to us; what is lacking within us, make complete; that which we do know, confirm in us; and keep us blameless in your service, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**Introduction to this week's Immerse New Testament Scripture readings:** Mark 6 revealed that faithful discipleship is costly and often puts us at odds with the world around us as we deliver unpopular messages. As you saw in 1 and 2 Corinthians, Paul had to deliver some difficult words to the church in Corinth. As you read Galatians, you will discover he has to do the same to the churches in Galatia. Toward the end of the week, you'll begin to read Paul's theological magnum opus: Romans.

Monday - Pray for all who are sick in body, mind, or spirit.


Tuesday - Pray for those who work in the media and/or arts.
