

Text: John 18:28-38

Devotion Guide

A Clash of Kingdoms

Verses of the Week: "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here" (John 18:36)

Daily Prayer: Almighty God, we pray you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: This Sunday begins Holy Week and this week's text take us through the story of Jesus' passion, death, and burial in John's Gospel as we journey with him toward the cross.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – John 18:19-27 - Jesus before the High Priest Caiaphas Tuesday – John 18:28-40 - Jesus before Pontius Pilate Wednesday – John 19:1-16 - "Behold, the man!" Thursday – John 19:16-30 - Jesus is crucififed Friday – John 19:31-37 - Jesus' side is pierced Saturday – John 19:38-42 - Jesus is buried

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. Reflect on this week's message on the clash of kingdoms that occurs in Jesus' trial before Pilate. What did you learn? What questions did the message raise? What does the conversation with Pilate reveal about Jesus and about the gospel?
- 2. As you read the Scriptures during this Holy Week, what themes emerge that have already been discussed in the Gospel of John? How would you describe this story to one who has never heard it?
- 3. Note that John often refers to the things happening to Jesus as "fulfilling the Scriptures." Look up the Old Testament references he uses (use a study Bible or annotated Bible to do so). How does Jesus fulfill the Scriptures in his words and actions?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for those who are in prison.

Tuesday - Pray for Christians who are persecuted and falsely accused.

Wednesday - Pray for those concerns listed on the TLUMC prayer list this week.


Thursday - Pray for all who suffer in body, mind, or spirit.


