The Undoing of Death Daily Devotional Guide

Verses of the Week: "For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so will all be made alive in Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:21-22)

Daily Prayer: O God, through your only begotten Son you have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity. Grant that we may, through the renewal brought by your Holy Spirit, rise up in the light of life and reflect your glory. Help us to live the life of your new creation and to reject collusion with the defeated power of death. In the name of the risen Christ we pray, Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: As we continue the celebration of Easter this week, the Scripture lessons explore the power of resurrection to bring new life to our world, our bodies, and our lives.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Ezekiel 37:1-14 - The valley of the dry bones

Tuesday – Daniel 12:1-13 - Daniel's vision of resurrection

Wednesday – Romans 5:12-6:14 - Dying and rising with Christ

Thursday – 1 Corinthians 15:1-34 - The importance of Christ's resurrection

Friday – 1 Corinthians 15:35-58 - The resurrection of the body

Saturday – Revelation 21:1-8 - Resurrection and the new creation

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. Reflect on this week's message on the undoing of death. What did you learn? What questions did the message raise?
- 2. Jews and Christians share in common a belief in resurrection of the body versus the immortality of the soul. How does a belief in resurrection change the way in which we view the material world, including our bodies?
- 3. As you look at the news this week, identify areas in which humans continue to collude with the power of death. How might a belief in resurrection change those situations?
- 4. The Scriptures invite us to imagine a new creation in which death is no more. How might we begin living in the present as if that new creation is already here in its fullness?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for those who are grieving the death of a loved one.

Tuesday - Pray for areas of our world locked in conflict and violence.

Wednesday - Pray for those concerns listed on the TLUMC prayer list this week.

Thursday - Pray for an awareness of your own collusion with the power of death.

Friday - Pray for God's new creation to be revealed in what you say and do today.

Saturday - Pray for those who are hopeless and hurting, that the good news of Christ's resurrection will be made known to them.




