Text: Nehemiah 1:1-11



Devotion Guide

Rubble and Ruin: Lessons from a Broken Wall

Verse of the Week: “Let your ear be attentive and your eyes open to hear the prayer of your servant, which I now pray before you night and day for your servants...” (Nehemiah 1:6).

Daily Prayer: Lord God of heaven, great and awesome God, you are the one who keeps covenant and is truly faithful to those who love you and keep your commandments. You have redeemed us by your great power and forgiveness. Give success to your servants today and grant us favor in the presence of those whom we meet. Amen.

Introduction to this week’s Scripture readings: The Book of Nehemiah is a story of reform and renewal. As you read this week, consider the ways in which Nehemiah begins to repair not only the breach in Jerusalem’s heart but also in the heart of God’s people.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Nehemiah 1:1-11 - Crisis and confession

Tuesday – Nehemiah 2:1-8 - Nehemiah before the king

Wednesday – Nehemiah 2:9-15 - Inspection and opposition

Thursday – Nehemiah 2:16-20 - An invitation to rebuild

Friday – Psalm 122 - Prayer for the peace of Jerusalem

Saturday – Psalm 137 - A song for exiles

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. Reflect on this week’s message on the human tendency to build walls. What kinds of walls do humans tend to erect—spiritually, emotionally, and physically? Name as many kinds of walls as you can.
2. Nehemiah responded to the news about Israel’s broken walls with confession. How do you confess your sins to God and others?
3. The message this week invited us to consider the rubble and ruin in our own lives. What did this invitation cause you to reflect upon? Name some of the broken places you’re experiencing.
4. When is it good to build a wall and when is it best to tear one down?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for self-awareness and humility.

Tuesday - Pray for those dealing with the consequences of past sins.

Wednesday - Pray for those concerns listed on the TLUMC prayer list this week.

Thursday - Pray for those who have become too comfortable with faith and those who are still outsiders to faith.

Friday - Pray for all who suffer today.

Saturday - Pray for those who will attend worship tomorrow, that they would be strengthened by the Word and the Holy Spirit.

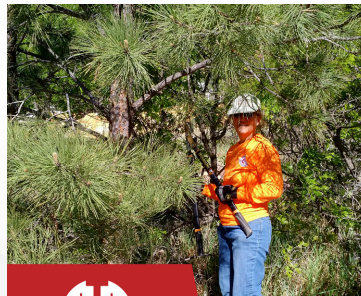

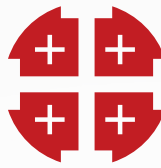
