

Text: John 21:1-14

Devotion Guide

Peter Goes Fishing

Verse of the Week: "Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It's the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard it was the Lord, he wrapped his coat around himself (for he was naked) and jumped into the water" (John 21:7).

Daily Prayer: Almighty and eternal God, so draw our hearts to you, so guide our minds, so fill our imaginations, so control our wills, that we may be wholly yours, utterly dedicated to you; and then use us, we pray, as you will, and always to your glory and the welfare of your people; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: Our readings this week take us through Peter's journey in the Gospel of John. Each day of the intercessory prayer guide corresponds to a theme from the daily reading.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – John 1:35-42 Tuesday – John 6:22-71 Wednesday – John 13:1-38 Thursday – John 18:1-27 Friday – John 20:1-10 Saturday – John 21:1-25

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. When you reflect on Peter's journey as it is portrayed in the Gospel of John, what stands out to you?

2. In what ways do you resonate with Peter's experiences in John's Gospel?

3. Think of a time when you feel like you blew it big time. Was your reaction to go

to God to work it out? Withdraw from God? Or, some other response?

4. How do you think the Holy Spirit is speaking to you through Peter's experience as it is portrayed in John's Gospel?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for friends and loved ones who are not Christians to respond to Jesus' call to follow him as disciples.

Tuesday - Pray for anyone you know who has turned away from following Jesus.

Wednesday - Pray for TLUMC to be an example of service in our community.

Thursday - Pray that we at TLUMC will be steadfast followers of Jesus, unafraid to confess our faith.

Friday - Pray for those struggling with sickness, death, and pain that they will experience the power of the resurrection to bring new life.

Saturday - Pray for those who are battling with a sense of failure as a disciple that they will have an experience of restoration on Sunday morning.
