#### Text: Nehemiah 4:1-9; Ephesians 6:10-20

## **Devotion Guide**

#### Minding the Gap

**Verse of the Week:** "So we prayed to our God, and set a guard as a protection against them day and night" (Nehemiah 4:9 NRSV).

**Daily Prayer:** Lord, help us to pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. Keep us alert and help us to persevere in praying for all the saints. Amen. (Based on Ephesians 6:18).

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings: This week's texts focus on a Christian disciple's best defenses against the spiritual enemy we face.

#### Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Ezekiel 22:23-31 - Who will stand in the gap? Tuesday –1 Timothy 6:11-21 - Fight the good fight of faith Wednesday – Jude 3-4 - Contend for the faith Thursday – 2 Timothy 1:1-14 - Guard the good treasure Friday – Psalm 141 - Set a guard over my mouth Saturday – Psalm 130 - My soul waits for the Lord

#### **Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:**

- 1. Reflect on this week's message on building on minding the gap. What ques tions or insights did it raise for you?
- 2. If you were to put together some "General Orders" for guarding the Christian faith and guarding your heart, what might they be?
- 3. Consider each of the pieces of the armor of God in Ephesians 6:10-20. How are you maintaining and using each piece in your own life?
- 4. What temptations and struggles are you facing that have created some gaps in your relationship with God? How will you repair and guard against them going forward?

#### Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for those struggling with temptation.

**Tuesday -** Pray for Christians contending for the faith in hostile situations. **Wednesday -** Pray for those concerns listed on the TLUMC prayer list this week. **Thursday -** Pray for the poor, vulnerable, and troubled in our community. **Friday -** Pray for courage to stand in the gap in your workplace, school, or wherever you go today.
