Devotion Guide

Friendship with the World

Verse of the Week: "You unfaithful people! Don't you know that friendship with the world makes you an enemy of God" (James 4:4)?

Daily Prayer: Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, grant, we pray, that we might be grounded and settled in your truth by the coming of your Holy Spirit into our hearts. What we do not know, reveal to us; what is lacking within us, make complete; that which we do know, confirm in us; and keep us blameless in your service, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings:

This week's readings begin with a prophetic text from Jeremiah calling us to reflect on ways we may have misplaced our devotion to things other than God. The next four readings represent biblical resonances with James 4:1-10. The final reading anticipates the text for next Sunday's sermon.

Tuesday – Matthew 5:21-26

Wednesday - Matthew 6:19-34

Thursday – 1 Peter 2:11-12

Friday - 1 Peter 5:6-11

Saturday - James 4:11-5:6

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. James is concerned with Christians living as exiles in this world. What are some ways Christian values differ from societal values?
- 2. Living in exile is a time of testing and temptation. What are some ways you feel tempted to conform to societal values that are at odds with Christian values?
- 3. Adopting Christian values over societal values is costly. Can you describe a time when choosing Christian values over those of society was painful and costly to you?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday - Pray for those in conflict with others to experience reconciliation.


Tuesday - Pray for those overwhelmed by the temptation to conform to the values of this world

Wednesday - Pray for the church to rightly discern God's values and adopt them over society's values.
