Devotion Guide

Introduction to this week’s Scripture readings:

Next Sunday we begin a new series focusing in the Book of Daniel. This week’s readings will give you an overview of the book. Don’t focus too much on specifics for now, just get a sense of the flow of the whole book and its many different genres of biblical literature.

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

1. As you read through Daniel, what major themes emerge for you?
2. What excites you? Confuses you? What questions does the text raise?
3. The Book of Daniel was very important to Jesus. How is this book important for our world today?
4. Daniel 7-12 features “apocalyptic” literature. We most associate this kind of literature with the Book of Revelation, with which Daniel shares much in common. Watch this short video by Dr. Ben Witherington III on the function and focus on apocalyptic literature in the Bible:

Monday - Pray for our youth as they prepare to re-enter school.


Tuesday - Pray for teachers, administrators, and support staff at our local schools.

Saturday - Pray for those who will attend worship at TLUMC this Sunday and for this upcoming sermon series to make an impact for God’s kingdom.




