Text: James 5:7-20

Devotion Guide

Patient Endurance

Key Verse: "You must be doers of the word and not only hearers who mislead themselves" (James 1:22).

Daily Prayer: God, we ask for your wisdom as we enter into the study of your Word today. We know that the Scriptures can guide us and lead us into knowing you more. We desire that so greatly -- to know you, to know your Son, to know the voice of your Spirit. May your words bring us life and hope today. Amen.

Introduction to this week's Scripture readings:

On Sunday, we concluded our series on James. Let's spend some time reflecting on the book as a whole. So often we read small passages at a time, but it's a good idea to read broad swaths of Scripture too. Thus, we'll begin the week reading the entire book of James in one sitting. Then, we'll read one chapter per day.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – James 1-5 Tuesday – James 1 Wednesday – James 2 Thursday – James 3 Friday – James 4 Saturday – James 5

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. Someone who has never read the book of James has asked you what it is about. How would you describe the main message of James in just a few sentences?
- 2. What do you like about the book of James? What do you find frustrating?
- 3. Think about the sermon series and how God has spoken to you through James. How did you feel encouraged? How did you feel challenged? What are you going to do about the way(s) you were challenged?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:


Monday - Pray that the Church will heed the wisdom of James and live out an authentic witness of faith that draws people to Christ.


