The Nine Essentials Week 5: Kindness Text: Titus 2:11-3:8

Devotion Guide

Daily Devotional Guide Week 5: Kindness

Verse of the Week:

"They shouldn't speak disrespectfully about anyone, but they should be peaceful, kind, and show complete courtesy toward everyone "(Titus 3:2).

Daily Prayer:

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we lift our eyes up to You this day. We look beyond the harsh, unkind, and dehumanizing environment that seems to pervade our world, and we gaze upon Your kind and loving nature that sees all persons as people of inestimable value created in Your image. Help us to rise above the low standard of our culture in our treatment of others to imitate Your character. May we not be conformed to the pattern of our world. Instead, let us sow kindness and courtesy in all our ways: in conversations surrounding our beliefs about You, discussions of our political convictions, in our social media posts, in our driving habits, in all we say and do. Help us to see others, especially those we disagree with, as individuals made in Your image and render to them the same kindness You have rendered to us.

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Matthew 5:1-12Tuesday – Matthew 5:13-16Thursday – Matthew 5:38-48Friday – Proverbs 15:1

Wednesday – Matthew 5:21-26 Saturday – Romans 12:18-21

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. How would you describe the ways in which the Lord has been kind toward you?
- 2. If a person were to interview people with whom you disagree, would they describe you as kind in spite of holding a different viewpoint?
- 3. Is there any person you have not treated with kindness with whom you need to have a conversation to repair the damage? When are you going to have the conversation?
- 4. How can you sow kindness in your sphere of relational influence?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday: Give thanks for the specific ways God has shown kindness toward you. Pray for the people in your life who have yet to come to know Christ that they would perceive the kindness of God toward them in their lives and respond to His grace and offer of forgiveness.

Tuesday: Pray that God will give you an opportunity to show kindness to someone today who desperately needs it.

Wednesday: Pray for the political climate of our country at the local and national levels. May the nature of our political discourse shift to one characterized by kindness in the midst of disagreement. **Thursday:** Pray for the Church Universal. May followers of Christ lead the culture by example in demonstrating kindness to all.

Friday: Pray for the culture in the United States. May courtesy and kindness become the rule rather than the exception.

Saturday: Pray that the Lord will lead someone who is hurting and in desperate need of the gospel to come to our church this Sunday. May that person be overwhelmed by the kindness of our church and the kindness of God and experience a transformed life.
