Daily Devotional Guide Week 4: Patience and Gentleness

Verse of the Week:

"Therefore, as God's choice, holy and loved, put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." – Colossians 3:12

Daily Prayer:

Lord, You have given us Your Word for a light to shine upon our path; grant us so to meditate on that Word and to follow its teaching, that we may find in it the light that sines more and more until the perfect day; through Jesus Christ our Lord. – St. Jerome

Daily Scripture Readings:

Monday – Romans 2:1-4	Tuesday – James 5:7-11	Wednesday – 2 Timothy 4:1-8
Thursday – Galatians 6:1-10	Friday – 2 Timothy 2:14-26	Saturday – Luke 18:9-14

Questions for Reflection/Journaling/Discussion:

- 1. Think back throughout your life and your journey with the Lord. How has God been patient with you?
- 2. When you think about the shortcomings in others that you find the most challenging to be patient with, are those shortcomings you struggle with in your own life?
- 3. Think about a time you had to correct someone. Were you patient and gentle? How does being patient and gentle change that nature of such difficult conversations?
- 4. Can you think of anyone you need to correct in some way? Have you been avoiding such a conversation with anyone? In thinking about patience and gentleness, how do these qualities inform how you should approach that specific conversation?

Intercessory Prayer Guide:

Monday – Spend some time in praise and thanksgiving expressing gratitude to God for His patience toward you. Then pray for those in your life who have yet to know Christ, that they would respond to God's patience and kindness with repentance.

Tuesday – Pray for The United Methodist Church as it experiences deep theological division. May patience and gentleness guide the discussions which seek to find a solution to resolve the division. **Wednesday** – Pray through the TLUMC prayer list at the bottom of the weekly email.

Thursday – Pray for those who are experiencing relational conflict friends and/or family. May there be patience, gentleness, humility that leads to genuine reconciliation

Friday - Pray for the nature of our national discourse. May it be marked by patience, gentleness, and humility. Pray that followers of Jesus would lead by example, especially on social media.




